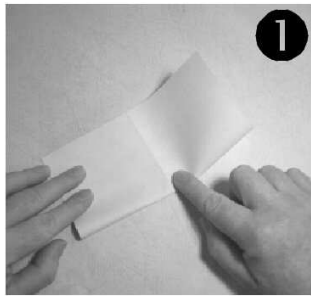
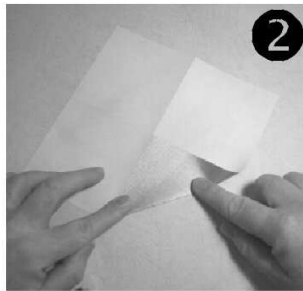


Traditional Box

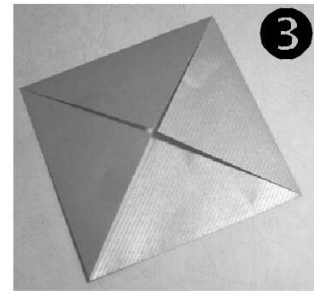
You will need two sheets of paper, both the same size to make this box. The size of the box will be one third of the paper size. Start with the colour side up.



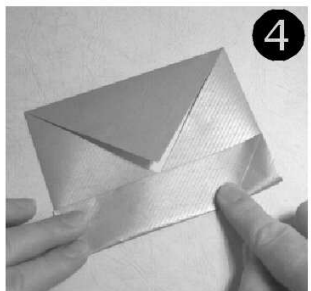
1
Fold across the middle, side to side. Open out and repeat across the opposite side



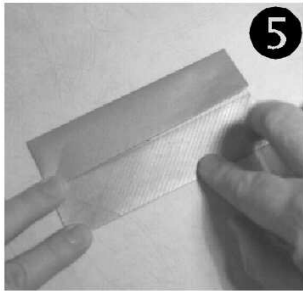
2
Fold each corner to the middle. Be as accurate as possible



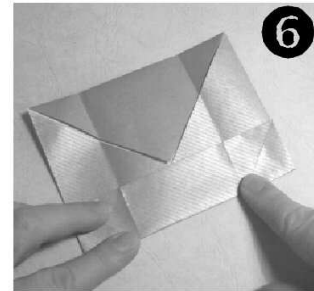

All four corners folded



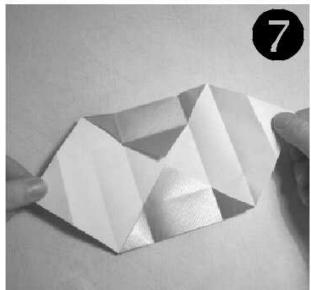
4
Fold the bottom edge up to the middle, where the points meet. Use the sides as a guide to your squareness.



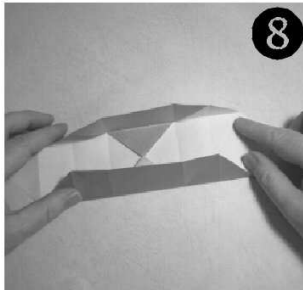
5
Turn the paper through 180° and repeat the previous fold



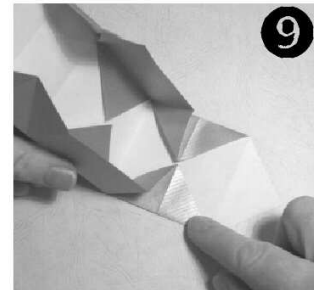
6
Open out the last two folds, turn the paper through 90° and repeat with the sides.



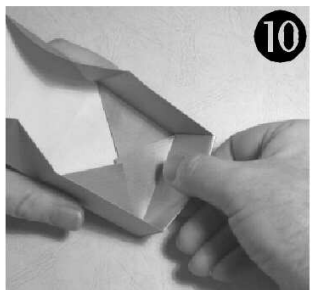
7
Holding two of the centre points, pull outwards, unfolding the paper as shown.



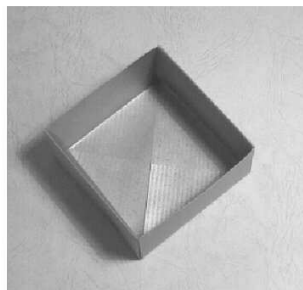
8
Using the creases in the paper, fold up two sides



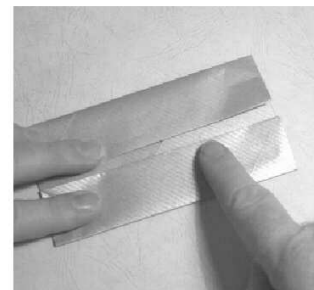
9
Lift the box onto its side allowing the sides to fold inwards on the existing creases

Tuck in the remaining flap and repeat on the opposite side



The base is complete



The lid is made in the same way as the base except for steps 4 & 5. When folding the sides to the centre, leave a gap of around 6mm in total (3mm each side) as indicated here. This will make the lid larger and allow it to fit over the base.
