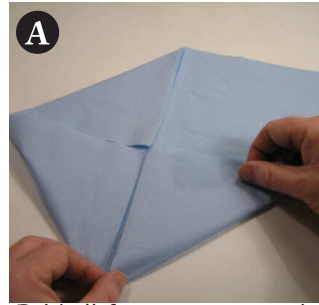
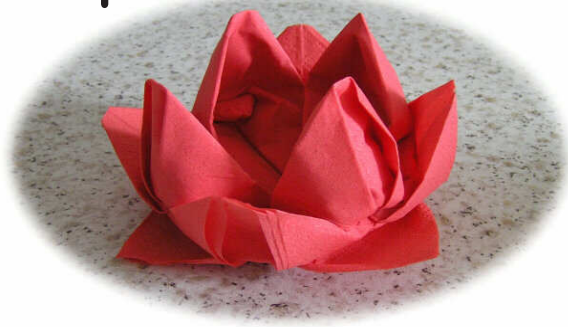
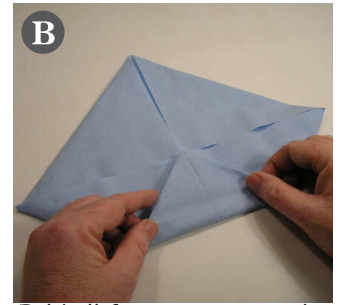


# Napkin Water Lily

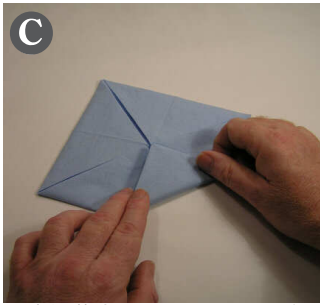
For this design, you will need a paper napkin at least 30cm square



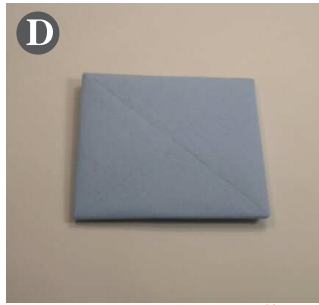
**A** Fold all four corners to the centre. Flatten the creases.



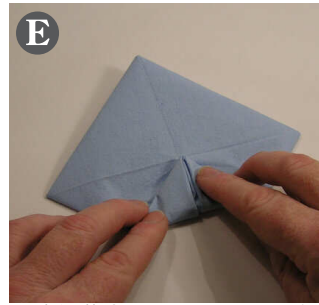
**B** Fold all four corners to the centre again.



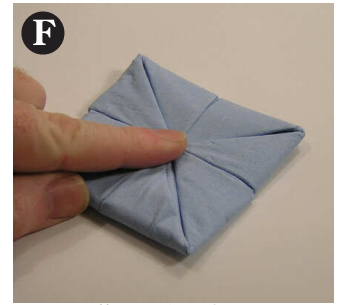
**C** Fold all four corners to the centre for a third time.



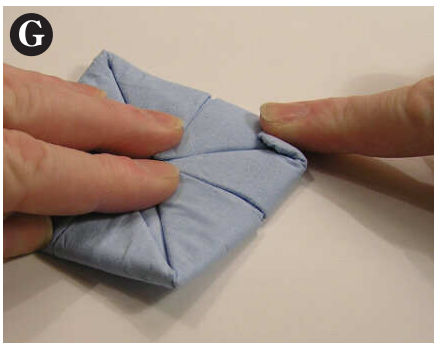
**D** Turn over and press flat.



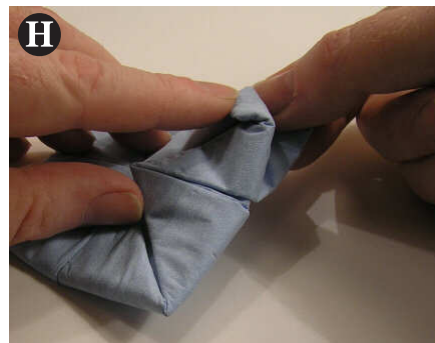
**E** Fold all four corners to the centre for the last time.



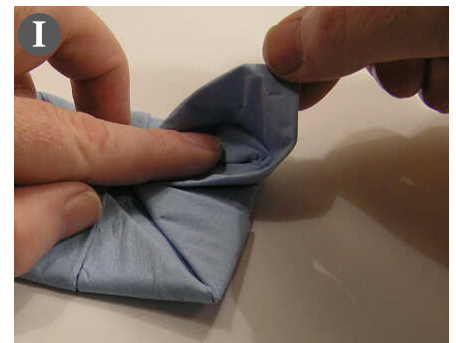
**F** You will need to keep your finger in the centre.



**G** Firmly kink over a corner and hold it in place.



**H** Holding down the kink, reach underneath for a flap.



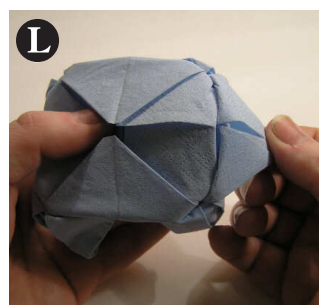
**I** Still with your finger on the kink, pull this flap straight upwards.



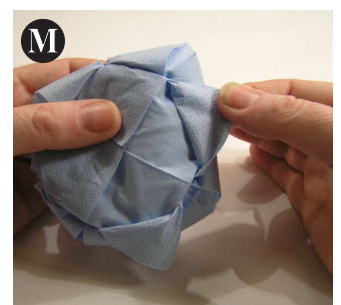
**J** The kink will now hold the petal in place. Repeat with the three remaining corners.



**K** With your finger in the middle, pick up the flower and turn it over.



**L** Peel back the four triangles as shown.



**M** Peel back the four squares now visible.
